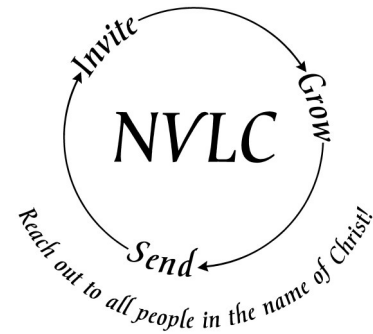

May, 2024

"United in Christ to strengthen our Ministries to adapt, grow and serve"

**1 Peter 1:3** *NRSV*

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! By his great mercy he has given us a new birth into a living **hope** through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead,

Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

**"He is Risen, He is Risen Indeed"**

We are still in the **Easter Season**, the 50 days leading up to Pentecost. During the 40 days following his Resurrection Jesus visited the Disciples numerous times to teach and encourage them for his exit from this world, his Ascension to the Father. It is observed on May 9<sup>th</sup> this year.

We need to remember that we are on **God's time table**. In Acts 1:6-8 at the time of his Ascension Jesus gave this answer about that **time table**, <sup>6</sup>When they therefore had come together, they asked of Him, saying, "Lord, wilt Thou at this time restore again the kingdom to Israel?"

<sup>7</sup>And He said unto them, "**It is not for you to know the times or the seasons which the Father hath put in His own power.**

<sup>8</sup>But ye shall receive power after the Holy Spirit is come upon you; and ye shall be witnesses unto Me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth." Ten days later during the Feast of Pentecost the Holy Spirit did come on the rush of the wind (Acts 2). Pentecost Sunday is Sunday May 19<sup>th</sup>; remember to wear Red that day.

Just about every service or time we come together and we **recite, not necessarily pray** the Lord's Prayer (Matthew 6:9-13), in it the third petition is "**Thy will be done on earth, as it is in Heaven**" it is easy to just slide over that petition as it makes us have to stop and think about who's will are we following, ours or **His**. Which is easier?

We remember Jesus's prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane (Luke 22:39-46) in which he, prays "**Father if you are willing, take this cup from me; yet not my will, but yours be done.**" We see that that night while the Divine spirit was there, he was fully human in that struggle. And where were his disciples/us, a stone's throw away sleeping instead of watching and praying. Again, which is easier? **God's will** or ours?

**We** are on this **Faith Journey** together, Hebrews 11:1 tells us "Now **Faith** is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things **not seen**." And that **Journey** is a race as the writer in Chapter 12 says "and let us run with **patience** the race that is set before us," (Hebrews 12:1-3)

**WE** all have been asking when will we see a Pastor or is our 3 point Parish is holding us back, was this best choice? What is the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin doing for us? These are all valid questions. Remembering that we are **human** and are used to things happening quickly! And if they don't who's to blame and how can it be fixed and how fast. I am just a guilty as any-one about asking these questions and challenging God.

Yes, **WE** all are increasingly impatient as time goes on. God **does** answer pray in His **time** and the answer may be different than what we were expecting.

There continues to be a Clergy shortage due to retirements and small Seminary classes in recent years. That does not mean that our new Pastor is not out there. But while we are praying and watching/waiting we need also to be **preparing**. One of the ways to prepare is by continuing to put together a calendar of Ministry projects/events and Worship events that each Congregation in our Parish is involved in by the month for the rest of 2024 through May of 2025 and regularly updating it. This will be something we can give to the candidates so they can better understand our Parish and Congregations and help us better plan so that we do not overlap events. We pretty much do the same thing every year. If you are not sure about an event put it in anyway as a place holder also include Apple River Conference and Synod events. I need the Worship Committee, the Youth leaders, Sunday Schools, WELCAs and Congregation Councils to get their calendars in to me hopefully by July 28, 2024 for the Parish Council meeting.

Our Congregations are doing exciting and great Mission and Ministry work in our Communities. Here are a couple of them.

**Our Outreach Ministries-**

We continue to be excited about the joint Food Shelf Ministry Between Faith Lutheran, Joy Lutheran and Our Lady of the Lakes Catholic Church in Centuria. The new location looks to better serve those in need our communities. While it reduced the exposure of Faith as a welcoming place to experience God’s love and his people. We can continue that exposure by volunteering at the Food Shelf. I would encourage anyone from our Parish to volunteer at not only this Food Shelf but others in our communities.

First Lutheran hosted a Red Cross Blood Mobile on April 16<sup>th</sup> at the Cushing Community Center.

There were 37 pints donated that day, very close to the goal! First members were there to greet and check in the Donors and then greet them with homemade goodies at the canteen. Everyone says that the reason they come is because of our goodies. Needless to say goodies will continue.

Yet another example of the exposure of a Congregation of our Parish as a welcoming place to experience God’s love and his people.

### “Do God’s Justice”

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This month we will have two (2) banners; the Easter Season banner “**God’s Promise of Hope**” through May 19<sup>th</sup> the Day of Pentecost and the banner “**Do God’s Justice**”.

May is Law or Justice Month and with the banner “**Do God’s Justice**” that we are called to ensure that all whether rich or poor, adult or child receives **just** treatment according to the law. God calls us to this cause in

#### Isaiah 1:16-17;

*16 “Wash yourselves; make yourselves clean; remove the evil of your doings from before my eyes; cease to do evil, 17learn to do good; seek justice, rescue the oppressed, defend the orphan, plead for the widow.”*

“**God’s Promise of Hope**” we continue this banner because as children of “**Hope**” we are called to “**Do God’s Justice**”.

The following verses are just some of the **Hope** and **Justice** verses,

#### Psalm 71:5 NRSV

For you, O Lord, are my **hope**, my trust, O LORD, from my youth.

#### Psalm 89:13-14 NRSV

<sup>13</sup>You have a mighty arm; strong is your hand, high your right hand. <sup>14</sup>**Righteousness** and **justice** are the foundation of your throne; steadfast love and faithfulness go before you.

#### Romans 1:17 NRSV

<sup>17</sup>For in it the righteousness of God is revealed through faith for faith; as it is written, “The one who is **righteous** will live by **faith**.”

#### Hebrews 10:38-11:1 NRSV

<sup>38</sup>but my **righteous** one will live by **faith**. My soul takes no pleasure in anyone who shrinks back.”<sup>39</sup>But we are not among those who shrink back and so are lost, but among those who have **faith** and so are saved.

#### The Meaning of Faith

11 Now **faith** is the assurance of things **hoped** for, the conviction of things not seen.

On May 9<sup>th</sup>, we remember the Ascension of our Lord when he gave the disciples and then us the Great Commission as recorded in **Acts 1:4-9** to tell everyone of God’s Great Love for Them and to wait in Jerusalem for the coming of the Holy Spirit (the Day of Pentecost) to help with the Great Commission. That Commission is to “**Do God’s Justice**” and to share “**God’s Promise of Hope**” in the Risen Christ.

<sup>4</sup>While staying with them, he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Father. ‘This’, he said, ‘is what you have heard from me; <sup>5</sup>for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now.’

#### The Ascension of Jesus

<sup>6</sup> So when they had come together, they asked him, ‘Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?’ <sup>7</sup>He replied, ‘It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. <sup>8</sup>But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.’ <sup>9</sup>When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. (NRSV)

We are still in the White-Easter Season until May 19<sup>th</sup> the day of Pentecost. The color for the Day of Pentecost is red for the fire of the Holy Spirit and for the brave Christian who gave their lives because of their faith. Then the color changes to Green for Growth.

In remembering and contemplating our own humanity it is “**God’s Work-Our Hands**” to bring and tell of the **HOPE** and **JUSTICE** in Jesus Christ showing while “**Words Matter-Actions Matter More**”.

## How to keep your memory sharp



### Get moving

Exercise increases blood flow to all parts of your body, including your brain. That can help keep your memory sharp. The generally accepted standard is to get at least 150 minutes of aerobic activity each week, which can include exercises like walking, yoga, or jogging.



### Flex your mental muscles

Mental activity also plays an important role in retaining your memory. Do a puzzle (like the one at the end of this article). Read a book. Play a musical instrument. Those types of pursuits will help your brain wire — or rewire — the nerve connections that help you concentrate, learn new skills, and retain memories.



### Keep organized

Clutter can be more than a source of stress. It can also make it difficult to think clearly and remember accurately. Jot down tasks and appointments in a planner or a virtual calendar. Keep important items like your phone, wallet, keys, and eyeglasses in a drawer or other designated place. Those small changes can tidy up your space, and your thoughts.



### Reminisce

There are probably certain names, people, and places you remember vividly — regardless of how much time has gone by. That's because you're more likely to recall information significant to you. If you repeat a scene in your mind or revisit a memory often enough, your brain has a better chance of accurately storing and retrieving the information. So organize your family photos and write down and share those cherished stories and memories with family and friends.

## Memory Booster: Notice the Numbers

Set a timer and give yourself 30 seconds to memorize the nine numbers in the left grid. When the time is up, cover the grid with a piece of paper (or your hand) and try to write the nine numbers in the blank grid to the right. Then check your answers.

**Hint:** Looking for connections between the numbers can help make it easier to remember them.
