Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

From "The Sermon on the Mount" Matthew 6:34 New Revised Standard Version Updated Edition

³⁴ "So <u>do not worry</u> about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring <u>worries</u> of its own. Today's trouble is enough for today.

This text is the basis for "From Worry to Wonder" the Synod Ministry theme for this year.

Remember back a few of months ago we all were worried that the snow was not going to stop or that the snow would not go away, and the ground would warm up in time to plant crops and gardens to get a good yield. And it did stop and the fruit trees did bloom a little later than usual, the oats/wheat came up, and the corn and beans came up. Our worry was for not. And as Jeanne and I put in our garden we found that the soil was warm but also quite dry considering all the snow we and rain we had this past winter. I said the rain will come no need to worry. Well, the rain has not been much if any. I am watching the crops suffer pastures are drying out, first crop hay looks to be pretty good but second crop might not be there. While we can water our small gardens it comes at a cost. For our farmers while some have irrigations for some of their fields that is a very small portion of what they have planted. Am I worried? Of course I am worried because the crop and then food prices will be affected.

We are a people of **FAITH** and the Holy Spirit is still with us today guiding us directing us as Congregations and a Parish in the way we should be going. Yes, as I said last months we are human and we worry about when will we have a Called Pastor guiding us on this journey, how will we know what the future holds? I am writing this after our Congregation Council met at First. While we were looking to the future with a little bit of worry, we were excited about what we have accomplished as a Congregation and Parish without a Called Pastor and decided that as Jesus said 34 "So do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring worries of its own. Today's trouble is enough for today.

That does not mean we don't make plans because you always need a plan. It means we don't get ahead of ourselves or God. We need to do this or the worry will eat us up. Mental Health professionals tell us this all the time. Worry leads to both physical and mental health issues. It is time we take to heart the saying "Let go and let God" God will bring the **Wonder**. Just remember it's all in **His** time not ours!

This past month we had Dana Paulsen a second year seminary student join our Worship Team. Dana is a great addition to our Team. We are working with her to see when her class and personal schedule will bring her back. Here is her Bio; my name is Dana Paulsen. I was born and raised in Luck, WI. I attended UWRF for music education and taught at Unity school for 25 years. I am a mother of 3 teenagers and currently finishing my 2nd year of seminary at Luther in Saint Paul MN. I enjoy nature, traveling, laughter and music. I am passionate about feeding the hungry and mental health.

We are in the season of Pentecost for the next 20 weeks the Parament color is Green for Growing.

We continue to celebrate what your Congregations have done so far while we have been waiting for a Candidate. Please continue pray for wisdom and guidance for your Worship Team and Congregation Councils and the Parish Council as we work to strengthen and improve the Ministry of the First Faith Lutheran Parish and Call a Pastor to Shepherd us on this Faith Journey.

"A Light to my Path"

July's theme "A Light to my Path" is to remind us that as we are on our Faith and Life Journey, God is our light for this journey.

This month's theme comes from Psalm 119:105 "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." In Exodus when God lead the Israelites out of Egypt the land of bondage "the Lord went be fore them by day as a pillar of a cloud, to lead the way; and by night in a pillar of fire, to give them light: to go by day and night." In John 8:12 Jesus said "I am the Light of the world". God is light and as believers in Christ and his finished work of the cross we are called to be salt and light to the world. Jesus said in Matthew 5:13-16 "You are the salt of the earth, but if salt has lost its taste, how can its saltiness be restored? It is no longer good for anything but is thrown out and trampled underfoot.

¹⁴ "You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hid. ¹⁵ People do not light a lamp and put it under the bushel basket; rather, they put it on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. ¹⁶ In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven. NRSV

As we continue our **Mission and Journey** as Congregations and a members the First Faith Lutheran Parish to call a new Pastor, we each need the **Light** of the **Lord** to show us the way **Stewards** of what God has given us (time, talents, and/or money) in our own lives and relationships as well as the life and relationship of our Congregation and Parish. The color for the 20 weeks of the season of Pentecost is green for growth. The book of Acts shows us how our MISSION started when Jesus gave us the great COMMISSION before ascending to the Father in Acts 1:8 But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.' Jesus is telling us that our MISSION/WITNESS starts at home and then grows out from there. So, we need to ask ourselves, how am I growing in MISSION during this time and am I being a good Steward of all that God has provided me? We are growing because we now have Teams/Committees that are making use of our individual talents/gifts to do things were done for us. We all are finding out we can do these things and are growing in MISSION and Stewardship as we do them it is "God's Work, Our Hands".

Always remembering that it is "God's Work-Our Hands" to bring and tell of the HOPE in Jesus Christ showing while "Words Matter-Actions Matter More".

<u>Loaves and Fishes Food Shelf</u>: In May, 34 households were served – 40 adults and 11 children. 82.75 volunteer hours. Donations: 485.5#, Money \$625.00; Weight of food going out: 1,721#; Waynes gift cards given: \$340.00.

Items needed: bread, eggs, milk, cheese, fresh vegetables (carrots, potatoes), fresh fruit (apples, oranges), canned meat, dish soap, lotion, toothpaste, toothbrushes, and paper towels.

The Loaves and Fishes Food Shelf is looking for a coordinator. Please talk to people about that. We have an Advisory Council from Luck Lutheran helping the food shelf continue. Also Gena Bugno and Pam Girtz are currently acting as co-coordinators. We can help train a coordinator.

We are now ordering food from St. Croix Valley Food Bank out of Hudson. They also bring our TEFAP food which comes from the government. We still order from Wayne's in Luck and Frederic Grocery story. We also welcome donations from anyone. We are trying to provide some fresh produce also, so please announce that if people have some extra homegrown items they can be donated on Tuesday and Thursday during the hours of 11:00 am -1:00 pm at 300 W 3rd Ave in Luck. Please also let people know that if they are in need of food and live in the Unity or Luck School district, they can come to our food shelf. The income limit has been raised to \$29,000 a year.

School Kits.

4 70-sheet notebooks of wide or college ruled paper approx. $8\frac{1}{2}$ X $10\frac{1}{2}$ " NO LOOSE LEAF PAPER; 1 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on 1 side and inches on the other; 1 pencil sharpener; 1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well); 5 new unsharpened #2 lead pencils with erasers; 5 black or blue ball point pens (no gel ink); 1 box of 16 or 24 crayons; 1 $2\frac{1}{2}$ " eraser; and 1 sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag 14 X 17 with shoulder straps . We have purchased backpacks – waiting to be filled!

Baby Care Kits Sizes up to 24 months - Gently used and clean items can be substituted for new ones.

2 lightweight cotton t-shirts; 2 gowns or sleepers without feet; 2 receiving blankets up to 52" square; 4 cloth flat fold diapers; 1 jacket, sweater, or infant sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap; 2 pair baby socks; 1 dark colored hand towel; 2 bath size (4-5 oz) bars gentle soap in original wrapping; and 2 diaper pins

Personal Care Kits

1 light-weight dark bath towel – between (minimum of 20"X40" to maximum of 52"X27"); 2 bath size (4-5 oz) bar soap, in original wrapping; 1 adult toothbrush in orig. packing or in sealed envelope; 1 sturdy comb; and 1 metal nail clippers (attached file optional)

Fabric Kits

- 2 pieces of cotton or cotton-blend fabric (no knits 100% polyester); fabric should have no stains or holes and be cut into a piece measuring:
- 2 ½ yards of 60" wide fabric; or 3 yards of 44" wide fabric; or 4 yards of 36" wide fabric
