"From Worry to Wonder"

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

From Jesus's "Sermon on the Mount" Matthew 6:34 New Revised Standard Version Updated Edition ³⁴ "So do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring worries of its own. Today's trouble is enough for today.

This text is the basis for "From Worry to Wonder" the Synod Ministry theme for this year.

This month I want to welcome Pastor David "Dave" Natzke to our Worship Team. Pastor Dave will bring Worship September 3rd. Welcome Pastor Dave!

Here is his Bio; I grew up on a dairy farm 20 miles south of Green Bay. My wife, Nla, and I have three sons and a daughter, with 11 grandchildren. Most of my ministry was in Illinois, although I served a dual congregation in the Marinette area and we spent 5 years in Brazil where I served a parish with 5 congregations.

I retired in 2009 and I have served as an interim pastor at 5 congregations since then. At present we live in Menomonie to be closer to two of our children and grandchildren. Pastor Dave

To answer your question; Where are we in Calling a Pastor? I do not have a good answer nor did Pastor Diane House from the Synod at the Parish Council meeting as there are quite a number of churches and parishes needing Pastors in the Northwest Synod as well as surrounding Synods.

That is why I ask that you continue to **pray** that God with send us a Pastor. Again remember it is all in **His** hands and Time!

As I wrote last month; We are a people of **FAITH** and the Holy Spirit is still with us today guiding us directing us as Congregations and a Parish in the way we should be going. Yes, as I have said in the last months we are human and we worry about when will we have a Called Pastor guiding us on this journey, how will we know what the future holds? I am writing this after our Congregation and Parish Councils have met. While we continue looking to the future with a little bit of worry, we were excited about what we have accomplished as a Congregation and Parish without a Called Pastor and decided that as Jesus said ³⁴ "So do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring worries of its own. Today's trouble is enough for today.

Again, that does not mean we don't make plans because you always need a plan. It means we don't get ahead of ourselves or God. Paul writes in 1 Thessalonians 5:18-19 NRSVUE

¹⁸ give thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. ¹⁹ Do not quench the Spirit.

Over the past few months the Parish Council has been wrestling with Parish Account balance. Yes, we are paying the Supply Pastors out of it but because they do not take as much as a Called Pastor the balance continues to grow. While some months each Congregation has had to use some of their reserves to cover the Offering short falls. There will be months even when we have a Called Pastor that we all will have shortfalls. PLEASE remember, just because we do not have a Called Pastor does not mean that the work of sharing the Gospel and reaching out with caring hands to our communities has stopped it us as members of the Parish that do "God's Work with Our Hands" the Pastor helps guide us. We still need your offerings we have other costs that cost more than the Pastor's salary to keep our ministries going!

When we formed the First Faith Valley Lutheran Parish we all said we wanted a Pastor with 8-10 years of experience understanding that the total compensation package would be \$120,000+ a year. We were

advised by Pastors Erin Nelson and Randy Olson of the Synod and Pastor Neal to have a year's package in reserve. That translated to \$4,000.00 a month per Congregation. At our August 23, 2023 Parish Council meeting the Parish Council voted to reach \$125,000 in the Fund, to refund the December \$4,000 dues payment which we have done twice this year already and at the Annual Meeting of the Parish in February, 2024 if we still have not called a Pastor to reevaluate the \$4,000 dues. We are looking at going to a lesser amount of \$2,000 each for example to cover the monthly Parish costs while still adding to the reserve. We need to keep in mind that when we call a Pastor we will need to make sure we can go back to the \$4,000 per Congregation.

It is <u>ALL</u> of <u>US</u> not just the Council members or other Lay leaders that keep us going forward so when a candidate does look at us and sees that we are not sitting on our hands waiting for someone, that we are doing "God's Work with Our Hands"

Please read the **Reach Out/God's Work-Our Hands** to see what we have done and what we can continue to do.

We as your Councils will continue struggle with and try to find answers to, Worship attendance/time, where are the youth and young families? Our offerings are not meeting our expenses/budget all the time, format of Worship/music. Again to keep you thinking; Worship times were setup so it was equal for all Congregations, and to give member a choice if they had plans. I ask you, when your Church has the 9:30am Service is the increase in attendance from your members or the other Churches? Does the format of Worship/music excite you will it excite others?

We are in the season of Pentecost for the next 12 weeks the Parament color is Green for Growing. We continue to celebrate what your Congregations have done so far while we have been waiting for a Candidate.

Please continue pray for wisdom and guidance for your Worship Team and Congregation Councils and the Parish Council as we work to strengthen and improve the Ministry of the First Faith Lutheran Parish and Call a Pastor to Shepherd us on this **Faith Journey.**

Again I say, it is time we take to heart the saying "Let go and let God" God will bring the **Wonder.** Just remember it's all in **His** time not ours!

Reach Out!!/God's Work-Our Hands

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Reach Out/God's Work-Our Hands is September's theme. At First we have two banners and both banners have Hands on them they are YOUR HANDS/OUR HANDS!

Our Parish has been Reaching Out for 150+ years to those in need of help and healing by God's Grace and Our Hearts and Hands in our community and cultivating relationships because of our Reaching Out. Your Church Councils and Parish Council along with Pastors who bring the weekly message are calling on US/You to use Our Hands to do Service Projects for those in need in our community as well as for the Community as a whole. Some of the ideas clean up someone's yard do painting for someone. We also need help with projects in Church building.

All through out both the Old and New Testaments God's people are called to Reach Out /God's Work-Our Hands and bear witness to God's Love and Redeeming Power to all the world.

Remember Jonah, he was told by God to Reach Out/God's Work-Our Hands go to Nineveh not Jewish people and an enemy city of the Israel and call them to repentance and to come to God. After arguing with God and then trying to run away from the task only to take a three-day side trip in the belly of the great fish Jonah went to Nineveh. Sound like somebody you know? And when Jonah did finally get to Nineveh and preached the Word, all of Nineveh repented and turned to God. Reread the book of Jonah for the whole story.

The Prophet Isaiah called the Jewish people of the Old Testament to reach out to all the peoples of the world in that day. Isaiah 43:10-11

10You are my witnesses, says the Lord, and my servant whom I have chosen, so that you may know and believe me and understand that I am he. Before me no god was formed, nor shall there be any after me. 11 I, I am the Lord, and besides me there is no savior. NRSV

During him ministry Jesus **Reached Out** to many people even though his disciples and the religious leaders of his day chastised him for Reaching Out to those sinners and Gentiles. Three notables of these sinners and Gentiles are two women, one a Samarian who had had 5 husbands and was living with another that was not her husband (John 4:1 -42) and the other a Canaanite whose daughter was possessed by a devil (Matthew 15:21-28/Mark 7:24-30). Both of these women were not Jewish, but understood or came to understand who Jesus was and went on to tell others about him. And Zacchaeus, Tax Collector from Jericho, Jesus called him down from the tree and went to dinner with him. Because of that and what Jesus taught Zacchaeus gave half of his wealth to the poor and restored fourfold that which he had taken wrongfully (Mark 19:1-10).

And in his Great Commission, Jesus tells us to Reach Out/God's Work-Our Hands to others, who are lost and hurting, first in our own family, then our home town, then our state, then our country and finally the world. **Acts 1:8**

⁸But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.' NRSV

This month as we have Rally Sunday September 17 to start off the Sunday School and Confirmation year. Sunday School will be at 9:30am for First, I do not have the times for the other Churches. We are still working on how to do Confirmation. September 11 is "God's Work-Our Hands" Sunday when our Councils encourages us do a Service Project for Someone. These are great opportunities to **Reach Out/God's Work-Our Hands** and invite someone who has no church home to come and hear the Good News of Jesus Christ. We can also Reach Out/God's Work-Our Hands to those who have not been with us in a while and to find out why that is and invite them back. God's Work is **Reaching Out** it is **Our Hands** as members of the body of Christ that are called to do the work. Our Pastors are here to help guide us as individuals and a Congregation/Parish and is a fellow worker as we Reach Out/God's Work -Our Hands to others.

As we continue in the Season of Pentecost, green is the color reminding us to grow in our relationship with God, fellow believers and our neighbors.



FOCUS ON FITNESS

Stretching: Myth vs. Fact

Most everyone loves a good stretch. But what does it really do? And how can you do it right?

There's no denying a good stretch can feel great. But while stretching can help ease tense muscles, it can also cause damage if you don't do it right. So how can you do it correctly and not get hurt? It helps to take a look at some common stretching myths and misconceptions.



Myth #1: All stretches are the same

There are two distinct types of stretching:

- Static: This is what many of us think of when it comes to stretching you hold a pose to loosen your muscles, relax for a moment, then repeat
- Dynamic: This type of stretching uses movement swinging your arms in circles or rotating your hips are two examples

Tip: Take your time. One rule of thumb is to aim to gently hold a stretch for 30-60 seconds. That will give your muscles time to lengthen and loosen.

Myth #2: Always stretch before you exercise

Many people stretch to "warm up" cold muscles. But a wealth of new research points out that stretching — particularly static stretching — before exercise doesn't help. It may even cause injuries.

So what to do instead? Walk or jog for five to 10 minutes or jump rope for a few minutes. All will boost your body temperature and ease you into your exercise routine.

Myth #3: Stretching helps heal sore muscles

This can do more harm than good. Why? The soreness you feel after exercise is often the result of microscopic tears in your muscle fibers. Vigorous stretches can make those tears larger—and cause more soreness or even injuries.

Be sure to stretch when your body is warm from light movement.

Stretch in a smooth, fluid fashion and avoid bouncing or rapid movement. Also, stay consistent — as with any exercise, you'll get the most benefits from a regular routine.

Finally, always check with your doctor before you start or change any exercise program.
