In all our experiments of pulling the congregation together this last year from Drive Through Events, Weekly Summer Bible School, Pop-Up church, sending kiddos bags of Biblical knowledge to keep them involved, sending letters/sermons to our homebound, projecting our services on Facebook...we strived to seek God's direction and found hope and peace in the process.

And the miracle of all was cleaning up the sound system, connecting all the pieces in one and eliminating a huge pile of incongruous wires that we never really understood. We now have a projection, recording, sound all smoothly operating. Not bad for a bunch of illiterate technical people putting it together!!! God continues his miracles...even when we can't see it.

As my last interim is done and I am moving into retirement, I know God remains and creates something new and great in the future of North Valley. God is in charge. Focus on God as your leader... Know God has a plan, stay focused... Seek God's direction, it works! God is at work, even when we can't see it...

North Valley Vision Statements and Goals

Acceptance and Community:

- Community publicized Pop-up services, Wednesday alternative worship, Kiddo bags for education, Contemporary music bring to service. Worship Committee to continue planning.

Willingness/Teamwork:

- As part of the body of Christ, North Valley will remain open and flexible to new ideas and approaches; encouraging all to participate in programs, training and services.
- Make a goal to contact and incorporate one new person in any event before we start planning. Recruit kids to bring their parents along.

Generosity:

- As a country church in rural Wisconsin, North Valley will support the community and global missions with financial means and donations of time, talent and supplies.
- Look for a project to draw the community into a relationship, something they need and we can help with.

2022 First Faith Valley Shared Ministry Agreement

Name of Area Parish First Faith Valley Lutheran Parish

Mission Statement:

"United in Christ to strengthen our Ministries to adapt, grow and serve"

I. Purpose: The purpose of this agreement is to provide a framework for the cooperative ministry among but not limited to the following congregations.

- 1. First Ev. Lutheran Church, P O Bx 758, 2385 Cty Rd N, Cushing WI 54006
- 2. Faith Lutheran Church, 305 1st Av E, Balsam Lake WI 54810
- 3. North Valley Lutheran Church, 1988 220th Av, Centuria WI 54824

II. Identity:

Congregations will maintain its own identity as it now exists as a member of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America and will be encouraged to participate in events of the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin.

III. Worship

- One bulletin for the entire parish may be prepared by the Parish Administrative Assistant and Pastor and/or worship committee.
- Scheduling of all worship services and occasional services Thanksgiving, Advent, Christmas Eve/Day, Lent and Easter will be done by the Parish Council in conversation with the Pastoral staff and Committees.

IV. Property

- 1. Each congregation will retain ownership of its church property and parsonage.
- 2. Each congregation is responsible for its own building maintenance.
- 3. If a Parsonage is used by the ministry, it will be rented from the respective congregation based on fair monthly value determined by Parish Council.

V. Individual Congregations

- Each congregation will have its own budget for activities that it will do alone, and its own church council to make decisions for the congregation.
- The records of the individual congregations shall be maintained and remain in the individual congregations.

VI. Structure:

- First Faith Valley Lutheran Parish will have a Parish Council that will consist of two representatives from each member congregation plus an alternate so there are always 2 People present from each Congregation and to prevent burnout. Each Congregation or Council will appoint/elect their Parish Council representatives
- Terms of the council representatives will be for two years. No member can serve more than two consecutive terms.
- 3. Pastoral staff has voice but no vote. Roberts Rules of Order will be used.

Civil Rights Journey with team from Northwest Synod

Day one of our journey was to follow the freedom riders and Martin Luther King Jr in Alabama. Did you realize there were 60 buses that went down to Alabama to help people register to vote. One bus they tried to burn the people alive. Horrific!

In Birmingham at our guest house, we met one of the survivors of the 1963 16th Street Baptist Church bombing, Carolyn McKinstry. The bombing killed four young girls. Carolyn Survived. We worshipped at the 16th Street Baptist and visited the Birmingham Police Department where Martin Luther King wrote his Letter from the Birmingham Jail. Surprised today to learn that the front steps of the Alabama State

Capital was the site of the beginning of the Civil War (inauguration of Jefferson Davis, confederate president) and a turning point of the Civil Rights Movement (March to Montgomery) and the inauguration of the segregationist governor George Wallace. Alabama River on the Edmund Pettus Bridge (while singing "We Shall Overcome") and Civil Rights Voters Museum. Big thanks to Airone Irby for the guided tour. Bonus: picnic in January with Lanny's BBQ. He even signed copies of his story in the Book. NWSWI Civil Rights Pilgrimage at the EJI Legacy Museum in Montgomery. Remembering and lamenting the transatlantic slave trade, lynchings...more later on our way home now.


